Aldergrove Minor Baseball Association recognizes the need to support our volunteers and set a minimum level of expectations for the parents of the players involved in our system. The Parent's Code of Conduct is intended to establish a policy that will maintain a level of mutual respect to the game.

Failure to abide by the Code of Conduct will result in a warning. Repeated breach of the code may result in suspension from team events.

24-HOUR RULE

I agree that I will not discuss any concerns from a game, practice or team event with any member of the team staff for a period of 24 hours after the game, practice or team event unless required to by a team official. In addition, I will review the issue with my son/daughter and then if I feel it needs to be addressed, I will approach the team staff and respect the process that is in place for the resolution of team issues

BENCH

I will not approach the bench during, before or at the conclusion of a game, skills or practice session unless asked to do so by a team official.

If my child is injured, I will await instructions from the team staff that is certified and equipped to deal with the situation. As a parent, I acknowledge and respect the relationship and commitment my son/daughter makes to be a member of a team. I realize and understand that my son/daughter needs to adhere to the values and goals of their team staff and the Aldergrove Minor Baseball Association in order to learn individual and team skills. As a role model for my child, I agree to conduct myself in a manner that will allow the values and goals of the team and the organization to be achieved. The code of conduct has been created to guide parents to achieve a level of mutual respect that will allow all sports participants to enjoy the full benefit of the events.

PARENTS ACKNOWLEDGE AND WILL ABIDE BY THE LIST BELOW:

- 1. Treat everyone fairly within the context of his or her role in the activity, regardless of gender, place of origin, race, sexual orientation, religion, political belief or economic status.
- 2. Ensure that comments or constructive criticisms are provided to the team or Association to encourage improvement.
- 3. Consistently display high personal standards and project a favorable image of the team, the Association and the sport.
- 4. Support Aldergrove Minor Baseball's zero tolerance policies by:
 - (a) Not publicly criticizing players, coaches, officials, volunteers and other parents.
 - (b) Not being under the influence of alcohol or any illegal drug while in the presence of the athletes at events.
 - (c) Not using profane, insulting, harassing, or otherwise offensive/derogatory language.
- 5. Communicate promptly and completely with training staff regarding diagnosis by registered medical practitioner's treatment and management of the athlete's medical and psychological problems. Consider the athlete's future health and well-being foremost when making decisions regarding a time frame for return to playing or training.
- 6. Understand that team performance goals take precedence over individual goals.
- 7. Treat opponents and officials with due respect both in victory and defeat, and encourage athletes to act accordingly.
- 8. Actively encourage athletes to uphold the rules of their sport and spirit of the rules.
- 9. Discuss all concerns with team staff in a responsible, respectful and open-minded manner.
